Silent Witnesses Speak the Stories for Victims

(EDMONTON) - "Every Victim Matters" is the theme of this year's National Victims of Crime Awareness Week, taking place across Canada from April 18 to 24, 2010. Activities across the country are focusing on raising awareness of services available to victims of crime in Canada, as well as further exploring new ways to reach out to victims of crime to let them know their experiences matter.

The Alberta Council of Women's Shelters (ACWS) is featuring their new Silent Witness exhibit to generate awareness about victims of domestic abuse. ACWS's exhibit features life-sized, free-standing, bright-red silhouettes, each bearing the name of an Alberta victim and the circumstances of their domestic-violence related murder.

"The Silent Witnesses help us understand that there are many victims of domestic violence living in every community in Alberta," said Carolyn Goard, Director of Member Programs and Services for ACWS, "and that domestic abuse can escalate and lead to the deaths of these victims and their children."

The Alberta Council of Women's Shelters will commemorate the Week by airing PSA's about the Silent Witnesses on CTV, displaying the Silent Witnesses at locations in the downtown core and conducting media interviews to bring awareness to the issue. The Silent Witness exhibit is available for use by families and friends of victims and community groups wanting to raise awareness around the province. The Alberta Council of Women's Shelters is an umbrella non-profit association comprised of 42 member shelters throughout the province. ACWS conducts action-based research projects, organizes training for frontline shelter workers and generates awareness about issues related to domestic abuse.
